

Boydell & Brewer is an independent academic publisher specializing in the humanities and social sciences. Founded over 55 years ago by academics, we have been proudly employee-owned since 2015.

We are excited to offer a cost-effective way for libraries to not only expand their subject collections but support opening access to new books through the international Opening the Future mechanism.

Designed with libraries in mind, our collections cover a range of disciplines drawn from our wide range of high-quality, peer-reviewed, often **award-winning** books.

Why choose Boydell & Brewer **Opening** the Future?

Opening the Future is a monograph subscription model that makes library funds go further through its collective membership scheme: achieving the dual objectives of enhancing collections while also supporting open access.

The Boydell & Brewer initiative is launched in partnership with Lyrasis and University of Michigan Library's Publishing division and its Fulcrum open source platform.

Members pay a small annual fee to get DRM-free, unlimited access to a closed selection of the well-regarded Boydell & Brewer backlist, with perpetual access after three years. The membership revenue is used only to produce new OA monographs, without forcing authors to find funding for book processing charges (BPCs). Opening the Future was shortlisted for an ALPSP Innovation in Publishing Award soon after launching in 2021.

DRM-Free Access: All content is DRM-free, ensuring ease of use for your library patrons.

Easy Integration: MARC and KBART files are delivered directly, or through OCLC, Ex Libris, and EBSCO integrated library systems.

Accessible Platform and Products: ePub as well as ePDF editions are offered through the born-accessible Fulcrum platform.

Value For Money

A three-year commitment to receive perpetual, unlimited-use access to 30 quality backlist titles will be charged at a discounted price, and it simultaneously funds new OA books. With this program, library investment goes much further.

No catches and no hidden fees. No bait and switch.

Supporters won't be asked to pay more on top of their annual fee to access 'more' or 'better' titles. Access to titles won't suddenly change. We pledge to be upfront about our fees, which titles are included in the book packages (and will stay in there), and about any other benefits or services to libraries.

Table of fees

Library and institutional members are banded according to their size. Based on this, our annual membership fees are:

Membership is for a minimum of three years. The slight rise of 2.5% in membership fees for 2026-2028 reflects rising inflation rates alongside rising production costs for publishers globally. The renewed fees allow Boydell & Brewer to continue to use membership revenue solely to produce new OA monographs, moving towards an affordable, sustainable model for the future of academic publishing. Shown in table are annual fees in USD (US Dollars, \$) / GBP (Pound Sterling, £), excluding VAT.
